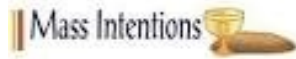

Weekly Thoughts

<p>My Friends,</p> <p>I am writing this on Thursday, as I finish my vacation in Mexico. I will be home in time to begin the most important week of our Liturgical Year namely, Holy Week. This weekend we embrace the Paschal Mystery by first celebrating Jesus' joyful entry as King into Jerusalem. Throughout this week we shall experience the Triduum, those events leading up to the Solemnity of the Resurrection.</p> <p>On Holy Thursday, we shall again recognize our Lord's gift to the Church of the Holy Mass, the Eucharist, the central form of our worship which we celebrate down through the centuries to 2017. On Good Friday, we highlight the death of the Lord through Crucifixion, a brutal death on the Cross which makes Resurrection possible for you and for me. Finally, on Holy Saturday, our Easter Vigil, we prepare for Jesus' rising from the dead on Easter Sunday.....that which explains who we are as Roman Catholics and makes possible our sharing in the Resurrection on the Last Day.</p>	<p>On this Passion/Palm Sunday, as we listen to the telling of the Lord's Passion, may we allow it to sink in and influence our daily lives. The First and Second readings, as well as the Psalm, reassure us, the faithful, to remain hopeful in God, even in darkness. We must recognize the Passion Narrative as a story of hope, seeing that Christ's suffering reveals God's love fully on display.</p> <p>Perhaps the best we can do this Passion/Palm Sunday is to prepare our hearts and minds to again contemplate the story of our Lord's suffering and death.</p> <p>As we participate in the proclamation of the Passion, may we do so with a new openness to the revelation of God's love on display. May we recognize in Christ Jesus a hope in God that is so secure, that it may rouse all of us to commit more deeply to our role in furthering the Father's plan.</p> <p>Lenten Blessings Father Gerry</p>
